Boat ramp funding boost for Serpentine

A major upgrade to the boat ramp at the bridge over the Loddon River on the Bridgewater – Serpentine Road will take place following a Victorian Government grant of \$83,693.

Fishing in the Loddon area is approaching its best after extensive stocking programs of Murray cod and golden perch fingerlings in local lakes and streams over the past two years.

The Boating Safety and Facilities Program, along with the Recreational Fishing Grants Program, are providing safe and reliable access for fishers to our waterways.

The upgrade to the boat ramp at Serpentine is jointly funded by these two programs and will increase the district's appeal as a great place for recreational fishing and boating.

Better boating access to Lake Tyers for anglers

Boating access to Lake Tyers has been improved following the installation of two new floating jetties at the Fisherman's Landing and Lakeside Drive boat ramps.

The improvements have been undertaken by the East Gippsland Shire using \$70,650 from the Victorian Government's Recreational Fishing Initiative.

The new jetties already proved popular over summer with many fishes enjoying easier and faster access to the water when launching. Better boating access will help locals and visitors make the most of the terrific recreational fishing opportunities at Lake Tyers.

A solar light will also be installed at Fisherman's Landing to illuminate the ramp area for those launching and retrieving boats after dark.

Divers fined for taking rock lobster with spear guns

Two Warrnambool men were fined \$1,000 each in the Warrnambool Magistrates Court after pleading guilty to using hand spears to take local rock lobster and other fisheries offences late last year.

The two offenders, aged 24 and 25, were observed snorkelling near Thunder Point, Warrnambool. They were observed and photographed by Fisheries Officers as they took a number of rock lobster using a hand spear and placing them in a bag hidden in among the rocks.

Our Fisheries Officers found a total of six rock lobsters, of which all but one were undersize. The smallest female only measured 77mm instead of the required 105mm. The smallest male rock lobster only measured 81mm instead of the required 110mm.

The men also pleaded guilty to exceeding the daily bag limit of two lobsters and failing to have a current Recreational Fishing Licence.

The men were fined \$1000 each and their diving equipment was forfeited.

VR Fish State election workshop
